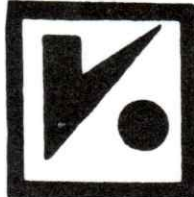

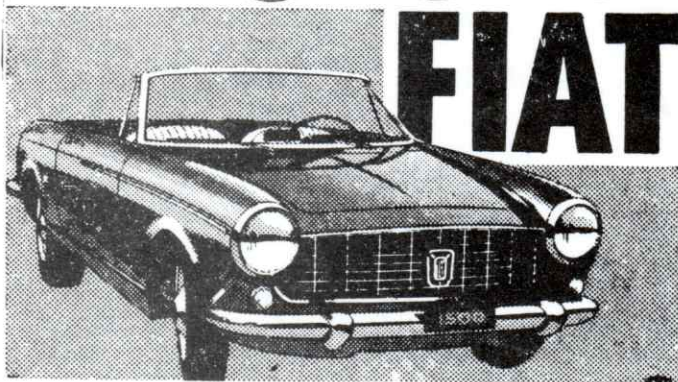
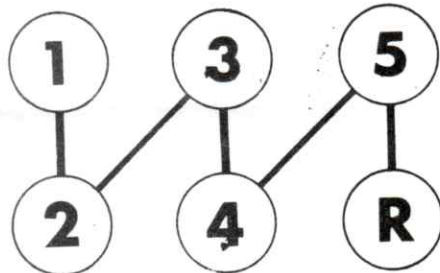

Entry Fee \$3.00 - One Class Only
Trophies - 1 each for the best six cars
Points same as any other VMSC event, however a car can be entered by a team of two and each member of that team will receive points the same as in a rally

Entry Fee for both events and the picnic \$3.50

Trophies will be awarded for the Concours just after the judging, Rally Trophies will be awarded later at the Regular Club Meeting so O. D.s can enjoy the picnic.
