WHEN: October 23, 1976 - 3:00 PM (after the Rally run that date)

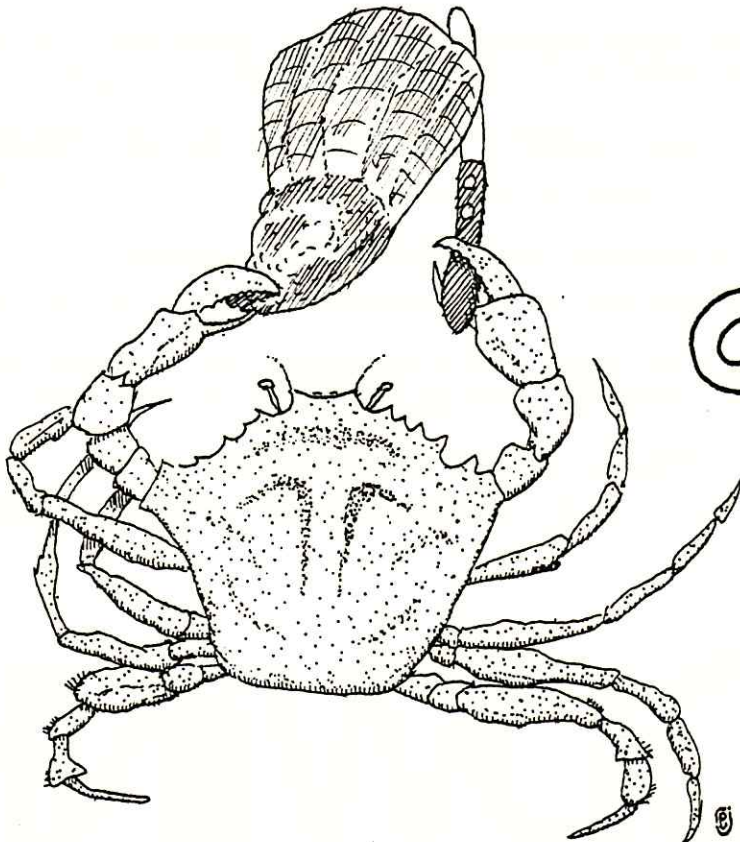

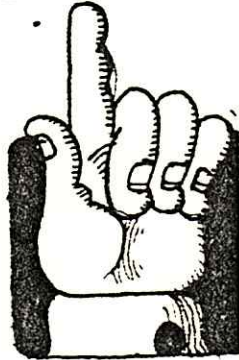
